Health Testing—OFA and CHIC

Our cover dog Willie, owned by Barbara and Don Dell, holds titles in Rally and Obedience as well as many health certifications, as you can see by the OFA and CHIC certifications following her name; she sets a good example for all of us. Since ours is a breed often pegged as “unhealthy”, it behooves us to follow her example and prove otherwise.

The Orthopedic Foundation for Animals (OFA) provides evaluations and certification for a number of animal diseases including hip dysplasia, elbow dysplasia, cardiac, thyroid, deafness, patellar luxation, sebaceous adenitis, legg-calve-perthes, and DNA. Hip dysplasia, for example, is a terrible genetic disease because of the various degrees of arthritis (also called degenerative joint disease, arthrosis, osteoarthritis) it can eventually produce, leading to pain and debilitation. It is important that we breed out of Bulldogs as many of these degenerative conditions as possible, and the following pages contain information taken from the OFA and CHIC websites that can help us understand how testing is conducted and what the results tell us.

According to the OFA, no one can predict when or even if a dysplastic

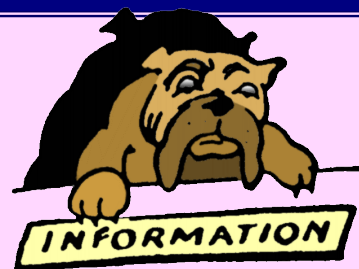

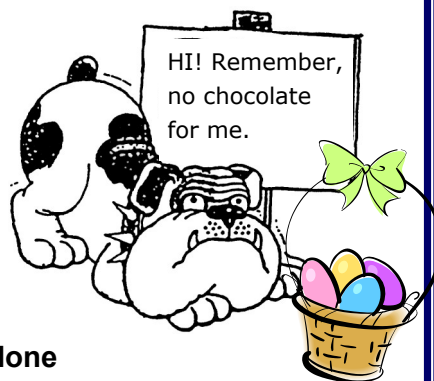

W hat illnesses are the most common among dogs? Do you know? The **top 10 medical conditions that dogs were treated for in 2008** (based on pet insurance claims filed last year) are:

1. Ear Infections: the most common symptoms are red, itchy or smelly ears
2. Skin Allergies: the most common symptoms are red skin, hair loss, itching
3. Pyoderma/Hot Spots: the most common symptom is a hairless, moist, painful area on the skin, often on the neck or rear end
4. Gastritis/Vomiting: the most common sign is vomiting and/or lack of appetite
5. Enteritis/Diarrhea: the most common symptom is loose or frequent stools
6. Urinary Tract Infections: the most common symptoms are frequent urination, inappropriate urination, or bloody urine
7. Benign Skin Tumors: the most common symptom is an abnormal lump or growth on or under the skin
8. Osteoarthritis: the most common symptoms are lameness, trouble getting up or walking
9. Eye Inflammation: the most common symptoms are a red, irritated or painful eye
10. Hypothyroidism: the most common symptoms are hair loss and weight gain.

So ear infections took the lead as the #1 problem for dogs on the Top 10 List, and benign skin tumors rank #1 in terms of treatment cost—they are

the most expensive to treat.

Most of the conditions on this Top 10 List will be accompanied by a noticeable change in the behavior or appearance of your dog. Watch for abnormalities such as lumps, sores, unusual odors or drastic changes in behavior. They are a good sign that it's time to visit the vet.

Many of these conditions are chronic conditions that often require repeat vet visits to treat and control. And, unfortunately, all of these conditions can be expensive to treat, which brings me to my next question: **Does your dog have veterinary insurance?**

What if your pet becomes sick or is critically injured and needs care that is expensive and you can't afford? What can you do?

This is a common problem faced by many Bulldoggers and it is not a problem that anyone enjoys. Even veterinarians would rather work on making your pet better, not deal with the financial dilemma behind the treatment.

So, what can you do if your pet has a problem that you can't afford?

1. Credit cards and checks. Many clinics accept checks and credit cards. This can help in some situations.
2. Care credit. Care credit is a line of credit that you can apply for on an emergency basis and it can give you immediate access to a credit card with a credit line, often at a fairly reasonable rate. Ask if the hospital accepts "care credit".
3. Most vet hospitals will give you time to make calls to family and friends or to visit a bank machine to come up with the required resources or deposit.
4. Other options. It may be that you can cut corners in some manner now to get you to a local shelter or humane society that may provide less expensive treatment or offer billing for additional tests (assuming of course that an experienced Bulldog vet is not required for the treatment you need).
5. Finally, if unexpected expenses are going to be

a hardship for you, the very BEST thing you can do for your pet is to get pet insurance early, before your pet has a problem. Get it when your pet is young and healthy and the premiums are reasonable. Also, consider taking advantage of the preventative care options that some companies offer. Next topic: Does your dog LOVE to chew? Most dogs do and most Bulldog puppies do.

If you don't give your dog his own personal things to chew, he will be forced to satisfy his natural instincts by chewing the things around him. And trust me, he'll find plenty of things that are pleasing to chew... like your favorite shoes, those new throw pillows or the living room sofa! Bummer.

Destructive chewing behavior can really test your undying love for your four-legged Bully pal. But, did you know that **it could also cause a lot of serious health problems for your dog?** Eating the stuffing in those pillows and sofa cushions can lead to serious gastro-intestinal problems. Painful splinters from chewed wood can cut your dog's gums or become deeply lodged in his paws or gums. Once swallowed, the buttons from your favorite sweater can become stuck in your dog's throat, causing him to choke.

Yes, dogs love to chew. It can be a soothing activity that brings your dog a lot of comfort—or a very dangerous one that threatens his very life. You can't change your dog's biology; fact is, he's driven to chew. So...what can you do? Well, to begin with you can make the activity safe for him (and easier on you) by getting him his very own chew toy.

Every dog needs a great chew toy. It can bring your playful pup tons of fun! A good chew toy will satisfy his natural urge to chew, help keep his life interesting and keep him contentedly entertained for hours on end. It can also help break your dog of those destructive chewing behaviors.

When you're shopping for a good chew toy, choose wisely. The wrong chew toys could lead to serious

health problems, including choking, gastro-intestinal blockages and painful dental damage. Here are some important safety tips.

Size matters. Avoid toys that are small enough for your dog to swallow or too large for your pup to play with comfortably.

No spare parts. Make sure the toy has no pieces that can be chewed off and swallowed. And watch the squeakers inside!

The right stuff. Look for durable toys.

Get involved. When you first give your dog a new toy, supervise his play to make sure he plays with it appropriately.

Keep it clean. Between the dirt and drool, your dog's chew toys can become pretty disgusting, not to mention a natural breeding ground for unhealthy bacteria. Choose a toy that can be washed and keep it clean.



"Bottle Crunchers"

Some good chew toys for Bulldogs are Kong toys, Nyla bones, and stuffed toys made of durable material and without button eyes. Bullies also seem to like plastic water bottles—they can't resist the popping/crunching sound the plastic makes when they chew it. There's a new water bottle cover in stores now called a "Bottle Cruncher". They were designed to give your dog the fun of chewing empty water bottles without the danger of hurting their mouths on sharp chewed plastic. These brightly colored "sleeves" look like cute little critters and they fit around an empty water bottle. As your dog chews, the bottle inside makes those wonderful crunching noises he loves but there are no sharp edges.

Bottle Crunchers can be refilled. When the toy gets "quiet," you'll know that your dog has pretty much destroyed the empty water bottle inside. So you can pull open the Velcro tabs and pop in a new one. And when they become soiled with slobber or dirt, just pop off the covers and throw them in the wash.

dog will start showing clinical signs of lameness due to pain. There are multiple environmental factors such as caloric intake, level of exercise, and weather that can affect the severity of clinical signs and phenotypic expression (radiographic changes). There is no rhyme or reason to the severity of radiographic changes correlated with the clinical findings. There are a number of dysplastic dogs with severe arthritis that run, jump, and play as if nothing is wrong and some dogs with barely any arthritic radiographic changes that are severely lame.

What Can Breeders Do?

Hip dysplasia appears to be perpetuated by breeder imposed breeding practices, but when breeders and their breed clubs recognize HD as a problem and establish reduction of HD as a priority, improvement of the hip status can be accomplished without jeopardizing other desirable traits. Prospective buyers should check pedigrees and/or verify health issues with the breeder. If suitable documentation is not available, assume the worst until proven otherwise.

Do not ignore the dog with a fair hip evaluation. The dog is still within normal limits. For example; a dog with fair hips but with a strong hip background and over 75% of its brothers and sisters being normal is a good breeding prospect. A dog with excellent hips, but with a weak family background and less than 75% of its brothers and sisters being normal is a poor breeding prospect.

OFA's Recommended Breeding Principals

- Breed normals to normals
- Breed normals with normal ancestry
- Breed normals from litters (brothers/sisters) with a low incidence of HD
- Select a sire that produces a low incidence of HD
- Replace dogs with dogs that are better than the breed average.

CHIC

The Canine Health Information Center, also known as CHIC, is a centralized canine health database jointly sponsored by the AKC/Canine Health Foundation (AKC/CHF) and the Orthopedic Foundation for Animals (OFA).

Mission Statement

To provide a source of health information for owners, breeders, and scientists, that will assist in breeding healthy dogs.

CHIC Goals

- To work with parent clubs in the identification of

health issues for which a central information system should be established.

- To establish and maintain a central health information system in a manner that will support research into canine disease and provide health information to owners and breeders.
- To establish scientifically valid diagnostic criteria for the acceptance of information into the database.
- To base the availability of information on individually identified dogs at the consent of the owner.

CHIC Benefits

Once in place and accepted within the dog breeding community, the CHIC program offers benefits to breeders, buyers, parent clubs, and researchers.

For breeders, CHIC provides a reliable source of information regarding dogs they may use in their breeding programs. In the future, breeders can begin to analyze the pedigrees of a proposed breeding for health strengths and weaknesses as well the traditional analysis of conformation, type, and performance strengths and weaknesses.

For buyers, the CHIC program provides accurate information about the results of a breeder's health testing. For diseases that are limited to phenotypic evaluations, there are no guarantees. However, the probability that an animal will develop an inherited disease is reduced when its ancestry has been tested normal. Further, as more DNA tests become available and the results are entered into CHIC, the CHIC database will be able to establish whether progeny will be clear, carriers, or affected.

For parent clubs considering establishment of health databases on their own, CHIC provides the answer with no upfront investment required by the club. The CHIC infrastructure is supplied and maintained by the OFA. The data is maintained in a secure environment by trained staff. The services are not subject to the time, technology, and resource constraints that parent clubs might face on their own. This frees parent clubs to focus on their core strengths of identifying health concerns, educating their membership, and encouraging participation in the CHIC program.

For researchers, CHIC provides confidential and accurate aggregate information on multiple generations of dogs. CHIC information will also be useful for epidemiological studies enhancing our knowledge of health issues affecting all breeds of dogs.

For everyone interested in canine health issues, CHIC is a tool to monitor disease prevalence and measure progress.

CHIC Policies and Guidelines

The CHIC database is a tool that collects health information on individual animals from multiple sources. This centralized pool of data is maintained to assist breeders in making more informed breeding choices, and for scientists in conducting research. In order for data to be included in CHIC, test results must be based on scientifically valid diagnostic criteria.

Breed Specific

Core to the CHIC philosophy is the realization that each breed has different health concerns. Not all diseases have known modes of inheritance, nor do all diseases have screening tests. Some screening tests are based on phenotypic evaluation, others on genetic testing. With all these variables, a key element of CHIC is to customize or tailor the CHIC requirements to the needs of each breed. These unique requirements are established through input from the parent club prior to the breed's entry into the CHIC program. Breed specific requirements typically consist of the inherited diseases that are of the greatest concern and for which some screening test is available. Each parent club also drives specific screening protocols. As an example, one parent club may allow cardiac exams to be performed by a general practitioner. Another parent club may require the exam to be performed by a board certified cardiologist. A club may also use the CHIC program to maintain information on other health issues for anecdotal purposes. Later, as screening tests become available, the disease may be added to the breed specific requirements.

Identification

Regardless of breed, each dog must be permanently identified in order to have test results included in CHIC. Permanent identification may be in the form of microchip or tattoo.

Informed Consent

CHIC operates an informed consent database. All information regarding test results remains confidential unless the owner specifically authorizes release of the information into the public domain. Owners are encouraged to release all test results realizing it is in the ultimate health interests of the breed and the information greatly increases the depth and breadth of any resulting pedigree analysis. For those not quite ready to accept open sharing of in-

formation, there is still value in submitting their results. All test information entered into the database is available in aggregate for research and statistical reporting purposes, but does not disclose identification of individual dogs. This results in improved information on the prevalence of the disease, as well as information regarding progress in reducing the incidence of the disease.

CHIC Numbers and CHIC Reports

A CHIC number is issued when test results are entered into the database satisfying each breed specific requirement, and when the owner of the dog has opted to release the results into the public domain. The CHIC number itself does not imply normal test results, only that all the required breed specific tests were performed and the results made publicly available.

A CHIC report is issued at the same time as the CHIC number. The CHIC report is a consolidated listing of the tests performed, the age of the dog when the tests were performed, and the corresponding test results. As new results are recorded, updated CHIC reports reflecting the additional information will be generated. For example, if a breed requires annual CERF examinations, an updated CHIC report will be generated every time updated CERF results are entered. Another potential example is as new DNA tests are developed and added to the breed specific requirements, updated CHIC reports will be generated as the test results are entered.

Once included in the CHIC program, the breed specific requirements are dynamic. As health priorities within a breed change, or as new screening tests become available, the breed specific requirements can be modified to reflect the current environment. If the breed specific requirements are modified, existing CHIC numbers are not revoked. Again, the CHIC number is issued to a dog that completed all required tests at a given point in time.

CHIC will provide the parent club quarterly reports consisting of both aggregate numbers and specific dogs who have been issued CHIC numbers.

CHIC Fee Structure

Test results from the OFA and CERF databases are shared automatically with the CHIC program. There is no fee to enter test results from either the OFA or CERF, and there is no requirement to fill out any additional forms.

To enter results into CHIC from another source such as PennHIP, GDC, OVC, or parent club maintained databases, there is a one time per dog fee of

\$25.00. To enter results from any of these organizations, a copy of the test results, the fee, and a signed note requesting the results be entered into the CHIC database should be sent to the OFA. Any additional results after the one time fee is paid are recorded at no charge. Additionally, there is no charge when entering results on an affected animal from a non-CERF/OFA source.

CHIC Website

The CHIC website is located at www.caninehealthinfo.org. The website contains basic information on CHIC such as its mission and goals, and maintains a listing of the participating breeds and approved breed specific test protocols. The CHIC website also provides a search engine to locate dogs that have been issued CHIC numbers, their test dates, and the results of their tests.

Participation

Any parent club interested in participating in the CHIC program should contact either the OFA or the AKC/CHF to discuss the program, entry requirements, answer any questions, or to request application forms.

Each breed should have a health committee and survey results which determine the major health concerns within the breed. The club should select one person from the health committee to be the CHIC liaison, and to work with the club's membership in determining what health tests should be considered for participation in the CHIC program. Questions to be considered are: what tests are currently available and being used, and at what age are the tests appropriate and reliable. Staff members from the OFA and the AKC/CHF will assist parent clubs during this phase of requirement and protocol definition.

The following list of breed specific requirements for Labrador Retrievers and Bull Terriers illustrates how CHIC has tailored specific test requirements to the health issues facing each breed:

Labrador Retrievers

- Hip Dysplasia
- Elbow Dysplasia
- Eye Disease

Bull Terriers

- Congenital Cardiac Disease
- Congenital Deafness
- Patella Luxation
- Kidney Disease

Rescue Report

Eight Leprechauns Arrive on St. Patrick's Day

March brought a basketful of surprise to NorCal Rescue. On Feb 2 we received a stray, young female bulldog. She was taken to our vet for an exam and vaccinations. She was found to be in good health but emaciated. She had an abdominal scar which could have been either a c-section scar or a spay scar. There was no indication that she had recently been in heat.

Twelve days later she was placed with a new adoptive family with a strict contract that if she came into heat, she was to be returned to rescue to be spayed. They were instructed to feed her "extra" since she needed to gain weight. Reports from the new family over the next few weeks stated that she was adjusting very well and was enjoying her extra food and gaining weight.

All appeared to be going well until rescue was contacted after the family became concerned about her sudden breast enlargement and had taken her to a vet who x-rayed her and reported she was pregnant.

She went into labor 36 hours later and delivered via C-section 8 healthy half-bulldog/half-"who knows" puppies, 3 girls and 5 boys, on March 17. Her new family was unable to assume this responsibility so rescue volunteers are currently caring for the puppies.

The puppies will be ready for adoption at approximately 8 weeks of age so referrals to good homes are needed, as are donations to help defray the cost of their delivery and medical care.

Thanks to nannies Courtney and Elaine Garcia, Pam Cardenas, and Suzie Melton for their loving care of the babies. They may not be purebred but they are sweet babies and deserve a shot at a good life.

Additionally, I (we) hereby assume the sole responsibility for and agree to indemnify, defend and save the aforementioned parties harmless from any and all loss and expense (including legal fees) by reason of the liability imposed by law upon or by the aforementioned parties for damage because of bodily injuries, including death at any time resulting therefrom, sustained by any person or persons, including myself (ourselves), or on account of damage to property, arising out of or in consequence of my (our) participation in this event, however such, injury, death or property damage may be caused, and whether or not the same may have been caused or may be alleged to have been caused by the negligence of the aforementioned person or persons or any other employee, agent, or any other person. I (WE) AGREE THAT ANY CAUSE OF ACTION, CONTROVERSY OR CLAIM ARISING OUT OF OR RELATED TO THE ENTRY, EXHIBITION OR PERFORMANCE OF THE EVENT BETWEEN THE AKC AND THE EVENT-GIVING CLUB (UNLESS OTHERWISE SPECIFIED IN ITS PREMIUM LIST), AND MYSELF (OURSELVES), OR AS TO THE CONSTRUCTION, INTERPRETATION AND EFFECT OF THIS AGREEMENT SHALL BE SETTLED BY ARBITRATION PURSUANT TO THE APPLICABLE RULES, BYLAWS, REGULATIONS AND PROCEDURES OF THE AMERICAN ARBITRATION ASSOCIATION.
