Onward and upward, Rudy and Cass — may you both reach all your potential!

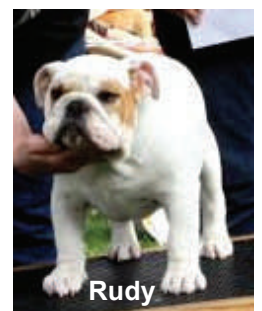

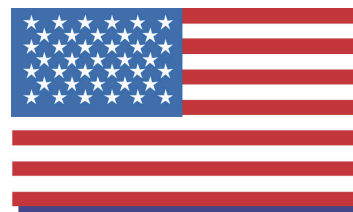

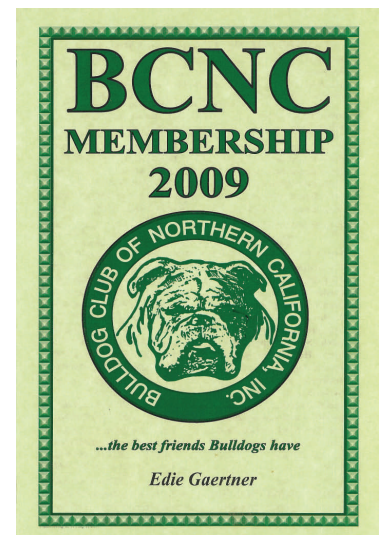

# Summer Safety

**S**ummer is here, and with it comes the opportunity for all of us to enjoy more time outdoors. It is great to include your pets in the fun, but remember these safety tips to help keep your loved ones healthy during the summer months.

## Summer Hazards and Backyard Safety

Look out for rattlesnakes — the incidents of human and animal rattlesnake bites are quite common. The last thing you want is to be surprised by a rattlesnake while you are hiking, riding, camping, having a picnic or participating in other activities with your pets. And if you live where rattlesnakes live, you should consider vaccination with rattlesnake vaccine.

Be aware of the signs of heat stroke in dogs! They include panting, drooling or excessive salivation changing to dry gums as the condition progresses, a rapid pulse, weakness and confusion. If you notice these signs, immediately attempt to cool the dog using cool (not cold) water, and seek emergency veterinary assistance.

Never leave your dog unattended in a parked car. Even in the shade and with the windows down, the inside can reach 120 degrees within minutes. Your dog is susceptible to heat exhaustion, heat stroke and even death under those conditions.

Pets can get sunburns too! Pets with short hair and pink skin are especially at risk. Consider applying sunblock around your dog's nose and ears if you plan to spend time together outdoors (it's best to look for sunblock that is labeled safe for pets). While shaving your long-haired dog may seem like a good idea during the summer months, it may actually increase the risk of sunburn.

Avoid strenuous exercise on extremely hot days. Extra care should be taken with older pets, and in very hot weather, try to walk your dog during the early morning or evening when it's a little cooler outside.

Make sure an outdoor dog has access to fresh water and shade at all times. If it's too hot for you, it's too hot for your dog!

## Water Safety

Swimming is a terrific way to cool off, and can provide good exercise as well. Water can also be treacherous, so keep the following safety tips in mind.

Not all dogs are natural swimmers. As with any form of exercise, be extra vigilant with dogs that have health problems, and overweight of older dogs. Consider a canine PFD (personal flotation device), especially if you take your pet on a boat.

Pools can be dangerous for dogs and cats. Make sure your pool is fenced in, and supervise your pet's access to pools at all times.

Taking your dog to the beach can be great fun but be sure not to let him drink too much of the salt water, and provide a shady spot if you're staying awhile. Remember, the salt water isn't good for his coat and skin, so be sure to rinse him off with fresh water after swimming in the ocean.

In late summer, the shallow water of ponds and streams can become breeding grounds for bacteria and algae that can be dangerous and even toxic for your dog. If the water smells funny or looks cloudy or discolored, particularly with a blue/green tint, find another spot to cool off.

## Backyards

Many people spend extra time sprucing up their lawns and gardens during summer. Remember, most plant foods, fertilizers and pesticides are harmful to or pets. Cats and dogs should be kept away from all lawn care products after they've been applied to your lawn and garden.

“Are mushrooms dangerous to dogs?” “My cat is nibbling on my lilies. It's not doing the lilies any good, but is it bad for her, too?” “Cocoa mulch smells good enough to eat. Will it harm my pets if they swallow some?”

The answers are yes, yes, and yes! Your yard could be full of hazards to your four-footed friends.

Several common plants can wreak havoc on the digestive tracts of curious animals. Foods that are tasty to humans

can be toxic to dogs. Some examples are raisins, grapes, walnuts, almonds, macadamia nuts, onions, garlic and chocolate.

In fact, grapes and raisins sent more dogs and cats to the pet hospital last year than any other accidental cause of plant-related poisoning, according to a new survey released by Veterinary Pet Insurance Co., the nation's largest provider of pet health insurance. That was followed by mushrooms, often the common backyard varieties. The average cost of treatment was \$427.

Almost all plant poisonings in pets can be prevented, but prevention depends on knowledge, therefore it is important for pet owners to become familiar with which items can be toxic if ingested. Grapes are a major hazard; even small amounts can cause renal failure and immediate treatment is essential. Symptoms include anorexia, lethargy, depression, vomiting, diarrhea and abdominal pain. Mushrooms contain toxins that can harm a dog's liver. Symptoms include salivation, dehydration vomiting and diarrhea. Remove mushrooms from grassy areas as soon as they sprout.

Several common plants also are highly toxic to pets. Those in poisoning cases reported by VPI were: lilies, sago palms, azaleas, hydrangeas, delphinium, crocus bulbs, hemlock, rhododendrons, gladiolus, tea trees, poison ivy, nightshade, tobacco, oleander, brunfelsia, hibiscus, scarlet pimpernel and kalancho. Almost all the lily cases involved cats. Our advice: Remove toxic plants, particularly from areas where pets will play and spend time unsupervised.

Cocoa mulch, a byproduct of cocoa bean processing, has been showing up at home improvement stores. But like chocolate itself, this dark brown mulch is highly toxic to dogs, particularly puppies. Fertilizers and pesticides also present a threat to our best friends. Watch your dogs and cats around any areas where fertilizers or pesticides have been recently applied.

## Heartworm Disease

A dog or cat can get heartworm disease through a mosquito bite. If the mosquito is carrying the heartworm larvae (infective stage) when it bites a pet, the disease is likely to be transmitted to the pet. The larvae enter the bite wound and move through the pet's body. The adult worms live in the heart, lungs, and nearby blood vessels, where they can grow up to 12 inches long.

Dogs, cats, and some other mammals can get heartworms only if bitten by an infected mosquito; the disease is not contagious from one animal to another. Heartworms in humans are very rare.

Most dogs and cats with heartworm infection do not show any symptoms until the disease becomes severe. At that stage, symptoms may include

- Difficulty breathing
- Coughing
- Tiredness
- Reduced appetite and weight loss
- Vomiting and gagging (usually only in cats)
- Lung, liver, kidney, or heart failure, leading to death

Heartworm is a difficult-to-treat and potentially fatal disease in dogs and cats, but it can be prevented with drugs approved by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA). Owners have a variety of products to choose from to help keep their pets heartworm-free.

### BREEDERS MATCH GUIDELINES:

- 1 The President shall appoint a Chairman at the beginning of their term.
- 2 The Match will be held at the Annual Picnic.
- 3 Only puppies bred by members in good standing in BCNC are eligible. Owner of SIRE or DAM must be a member at the time of breeding and must abide by the BCNC Code of Ethics. If SIRE or DAM is co-owned, only one owner must be a member of BCNC.
- 4 Owners of puppies at the time of the Match MAY or MAY NOT be members.
- 5 All awards will be presented to the member breeder of the puppy. If there are co-owners, only members of BCNC will be listed for wins in the Club bulletin.
- 6 Age limit of puppies will be 3 months to 18 months (by the Match date).
- 7 Puppies may only be shown once in a Breeders Match.

### ENTRIES WILL BE JUDGED IN THE FOLLOWING MANNER:

- 1 Males and females will be judged separately.
- 2 When total entry is 14 or less, there will be two classes— Dog and Bitch
- 3 When the number of entries is 15 or more, they will be divided into classes:
  - ◆ 3 months to 6 months, Dogs and Bitches
  - ◆ 6 months to 9 months, Dogs and Bitches
  - ◆ 9 months to 15 months, Dogs and Bitches
- 4 The judge selects up to 4 puppies from each class. These puppies will make the final class.
- 5 From the final class, first through fourth is selected.

Entry fee will be \$10.00 per dog. Match Chairman may show at this match. Recording Secretary confirms breeder as a member in good standing.

Prizes will be awarded as follows:

- 1st ◆ 40% of total entry fee
- 2nd ◆ 25% of total entry fee
- 3rd ◆ 15% of total entry fee
- 4th ◆ 10% of total entry fee

The Club retains 10% for administrative costs.

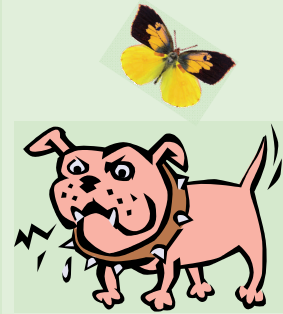

## Rescue Report — Saying Goodbye to Ariel



This is not the update I had planned. I can quickly relate that happily all the octopups are either placed or on their way to a good home. Thanks to all who sent their well wishes to the adorable, but unexpected, spring surprises. The non-ending line of needy ones are ever present; we are coping, at least for now. But this report needs to be dedicated to a dog that was an ambassador for our rescue effort. She represented our club at the Nationals in Santa Clara in the Rescue Parade, and attended many events and dog shows as a rescue representative.

Many of you know of my Ariel. I would like this to be a small tribute to her life and the many things she taught me. She died in her bed, peacefully, this afternoon.

Ariel came into our program in April, 6 years ago. She had been purchased from a “breeder” for the purpose of being an income generating brood bitch at 9 months of age.

I had no doubts that the unsuspecting person who purchased her knew nothing about Bulldogs but had dollar signs in their eyes. They were actively showing in another breed and had apparently seen the potential for making money in Bulldogs.

She proved to be a medical disaster for them: eye issues, chronic ear and skin infections and orthopedic issues that could have been textbook material. And to top it all off, she didn’t have puppies.

Soon she was relegated to their back yard where she spent her days seeking shelter and shade under bushes until the day came when they had enough of the vet bills and chronic unsolvable medical issues and the appointment was made to euthanize her. A “friend” of the owners heard their plan and was very upset by what was to come. She took Ariel to her home temporarily and called rescue.

I had been at a dog show about a 45-minute drive from where she was being housed. I had had a very good weekend and was only mildly inconvenienced with the out-of-the-way stop on my way home. Thinking this would be a quick stop, I pulled up to the address to see this pathetic but once beautiful girl sitting in an ex-pen under a tree in their front yard. They had no room for her in their house. It was as if her entire world had been reduced to that small ex-pen and she was calmly awaiting her fate. The Good Samaritan who had housed her overnight had a houseful of Min-Pins and obviously could not cope with her. Her medical condition was horrible; her ears were so infected that they stood upright like Frenchie ears with large hematomas; skin in horrible shape, etc. I will spare you further details. I have seen some bad situations over the years, but Ariel caused me to burst into tears. I think I cried most of the way home that night talking all the way home to her in the back of the car, but I promised her that she would never be without warmth or love or care again. And she wasn’t. I knew she would never be place-able.

We walked through more medical issues that I can remember: her ear/skin issues were never totally solvable, she eventually had an ear ablation, and lost an eye to cancer. But she graced our house for 6 years and I wouldn’t have traded her for the next national winner. She tolerated many puppies with good humor, helped tame our feral cats, and reminded me every day why I love this breed and why to love this breed is to help rescue them.

Rest well, Ariel.

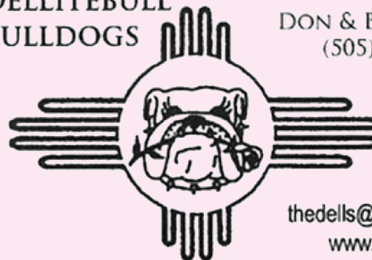

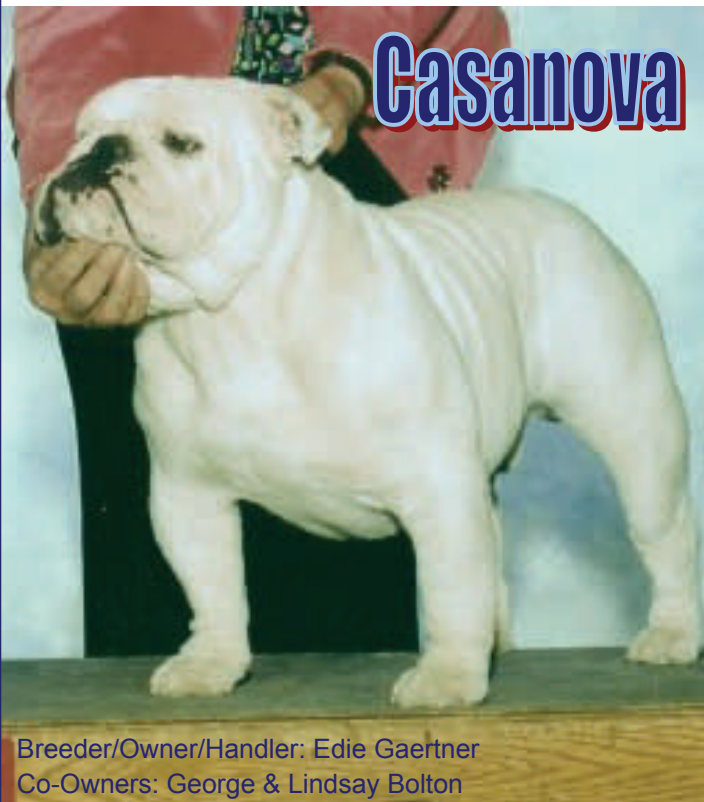
